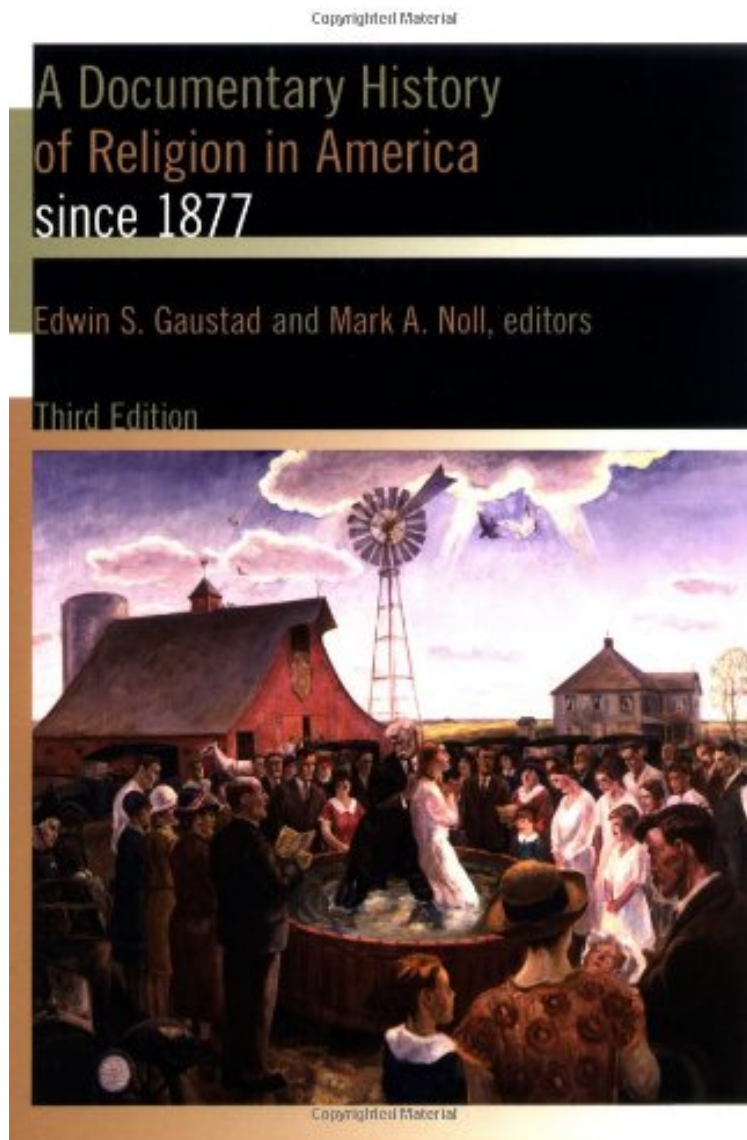

The title basically says it all. It's a compilation of primary source document citations since 1877. It picks up right where the last volume left off and is updated every several years, apparently. There are excellent introductions to the chapters and the selections on suggested reading material are incredibly thorough. I'm not sure if I'd buy this new or not, but a used copy is only a few bucks and definitely worth the price.

The second volume covers the period from when the dust of the Civil War has settled to the dawn of the 21st century. The documents are almost all by people actively engaged in religion, and so reflect the course of religion itself rather than an external view of it. The chronological chapters focus
