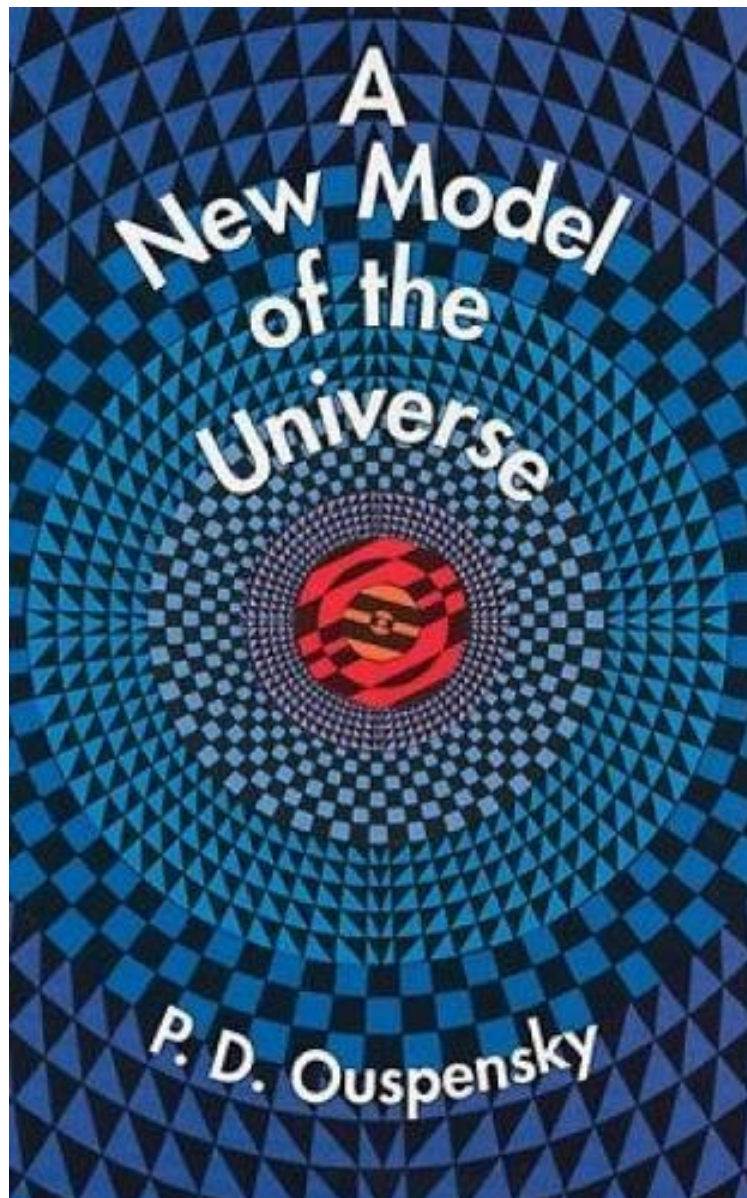

He challenges your thinking on every subject you only thought you knew a great deal about. He was a profoundly deep thinker, and a remarkable writer. He, for instance, explained the Fourth Dimension as a cube. You know, the cube (square) I'm sure many of us have drawn with a pencil on a piece of paper. He writes, "From the fourth dimension it must be possible to see the cube from all its sides at once and from within as though from its center." Then he challenges the reader to see this clear-shaped cube turning slowing in mid-air. One can see all four sides of the cube, and see right through it. He challenges his reader to continue "to imagine further the properties of vision or perception in the fourth dimension." When you've finished this chapter, you, as his reader, clearly see the possibilities of the Fourth Dimension. He is a brilliant writer, thinker, and has an amazing mind .

Along with Aleister Crowley, Madame Blavatsky, and George Gurdjieff, P. D. Ouspensky (1878-1947) was one of the most important and influential figures in the occult movements of the twentieth century. With such books as *The Fourth Dimension* (incorporated in this present volume), *Tertium Organum*, *In Search of the Miraculous*, and *The Psychology of Man's Possible Evolution*, he earned a loyal following among those seeking a deeper knowledge of themselves and their lives, and of the meaning of human existence.
