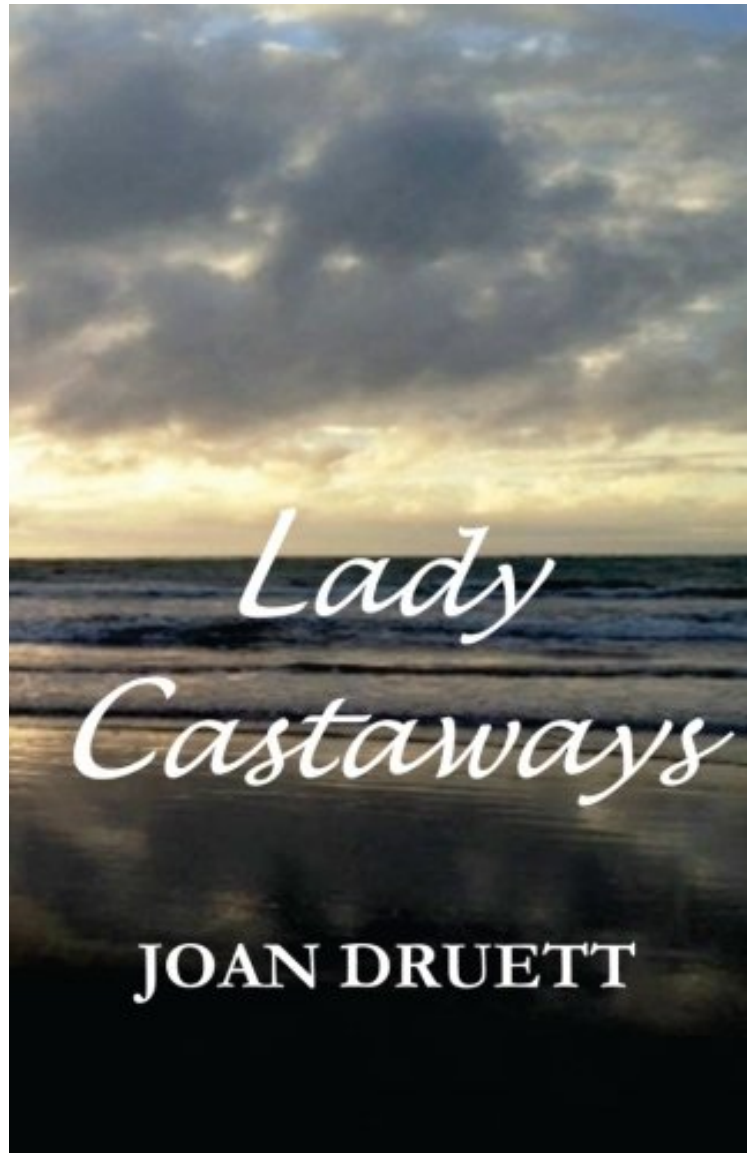

For them the dangers of the deep are not unknown, even so, how they face

up to the diabolical situations they find themselves in, often being the sole female aboard, is remarkable. While some suffer at the hands of fellow (male) victims, most show incredible courage. Even prior to the ship foundering some demonstrate qualities of leadership, seamanship and nautical instinct. *Lady Castaways* is a readable and well researched collection of tales about ladies who have survived a shipwreck and lived to tell the tale.
