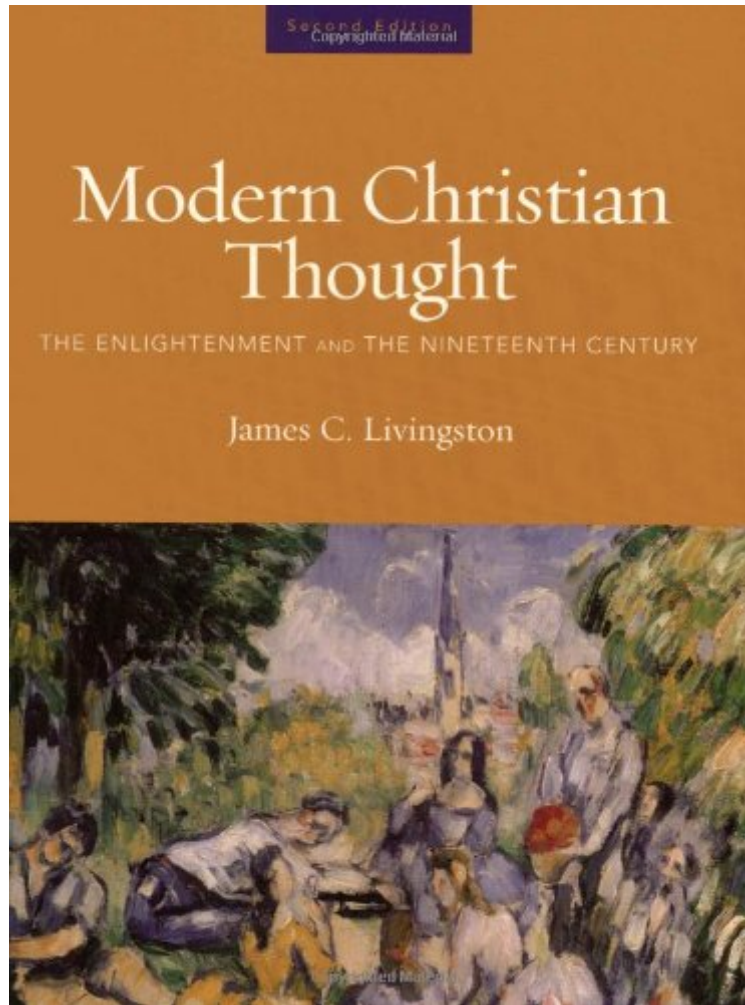

Each theologian is well summarized and located within the various movements of Christian thought. Many of today's religious issues have their antecedents in the 19th century: individual autonomy vs group solidarity, reason vs tradition, and the objective vs subjective aspects of reality.
