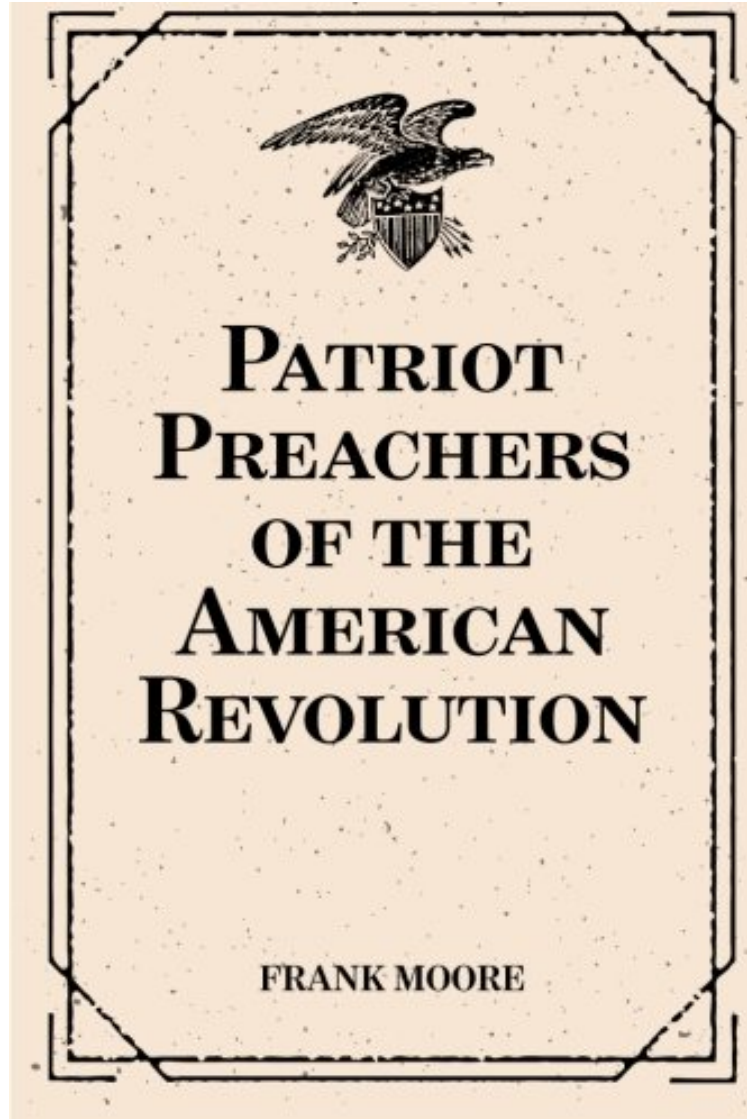

consistently, the feeling conveyed of unjust treatment, and the need to redress grievances and the call to arms for preservation and to defend themselves. All of which was equally recognized by loyalists. These preachers confirmed that against odds 13 separate colonies came together under one banner and unanimously chose of George Washington to lead the Continental army. They uniformly recognized "Heaven's hand," and the Sermon of John Rodgers particularly inspired me to thankfulness.
