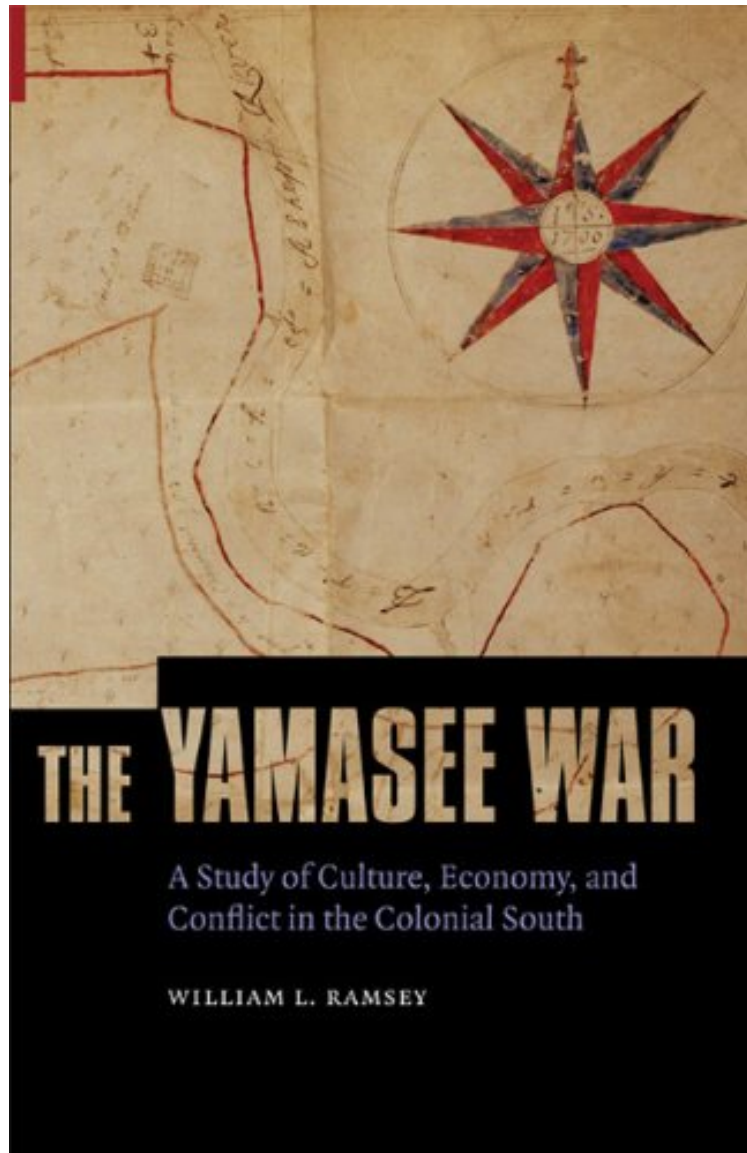

This work discusses the causes, nature, and consequences of the Yamasee War. He notes that older explanations of the war focused too much on trader corruption and abuse and not enough of the political and economic aspects of the situation. The author makes a good reconstruction of the economic and political situation in the native and colonial southeast at the time. There is not a substantial narrative of the war in this publication, therefore those looking for such a work might look at the older accounts. These earlier accounts include a chapter length discussion in the work of Crane (The Southern Frontier). This book is quite well written and is valuable to all those interested in early southeastern history and Native American colonial interactions.
