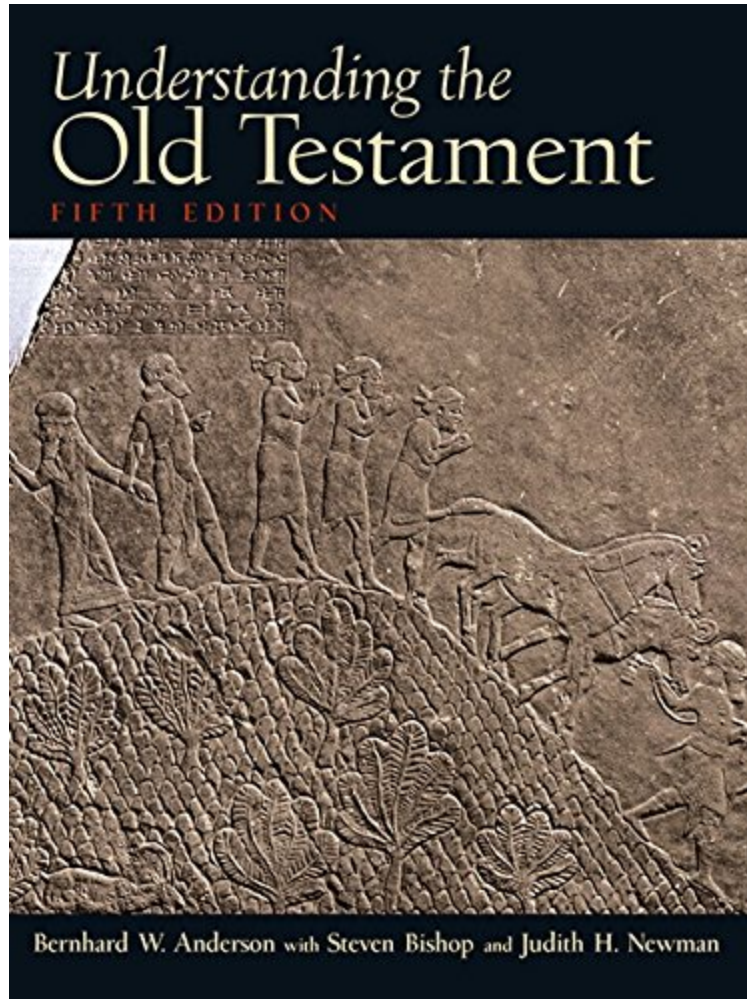

Since then there are newer versions by joint authors or even new authors. This is an excellent book for biblical students and pastors who want a biblical overview of research in the Hebrew Scriptures. Also quite good for Bible teachers who wish to delve into particular areas such as the shift in thinking about the Deuteronomic Historian and history that reshaped much of the writings of the Pentateuch in a retrospective point of view.
