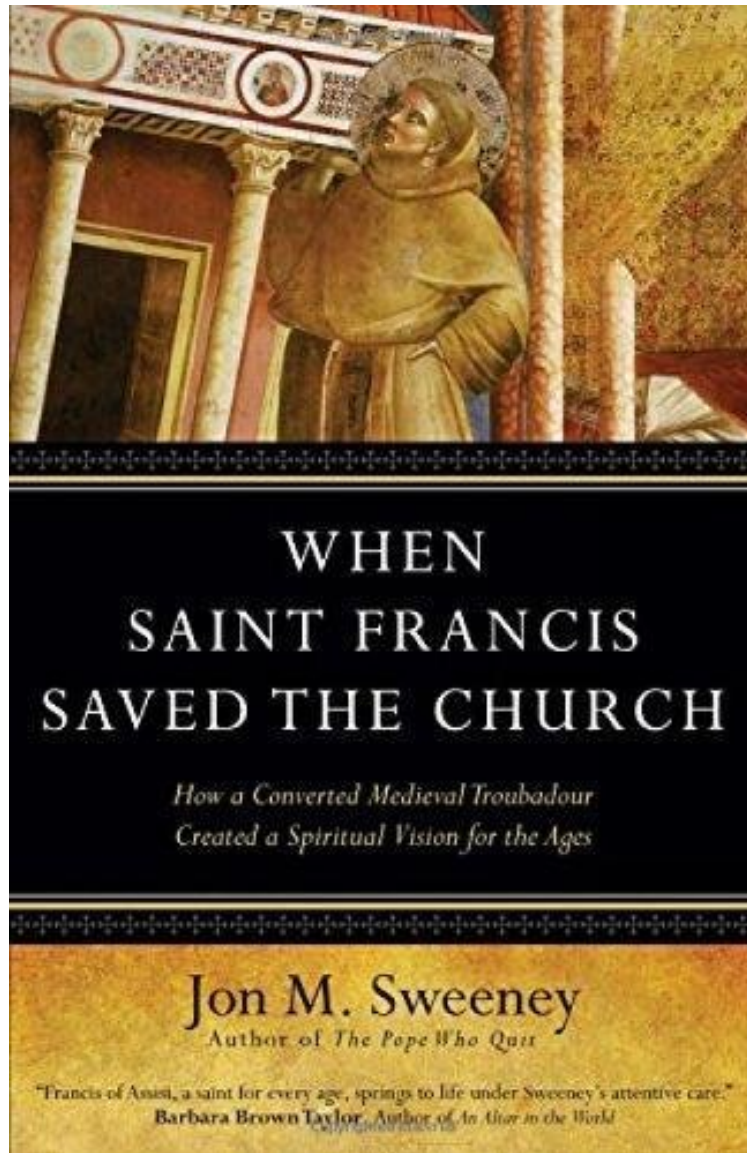

By Janet Nail To many people, Francis of Assisi is a harmless statue in the garden, pleasant to look at but not important. But Francis is more than that; Francis is saint who began by believing Jesus, by following the commands of Jesus. Sell all your goods and give to the poor? We think of that as metaphorical, but to Francis, this was a literal command. If it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of Heaven, the answer is to renounce riches and pay attention to what matters. Jon Sweeney has presented us with a saint who believed in Jesus, who followed Jesus, who set out to emulate Jesus. He identifies the gifts that made Francis the effective emissary of God who could rebuild the church because he understood that the church--that God--is not about accumulating wealth or having power.
