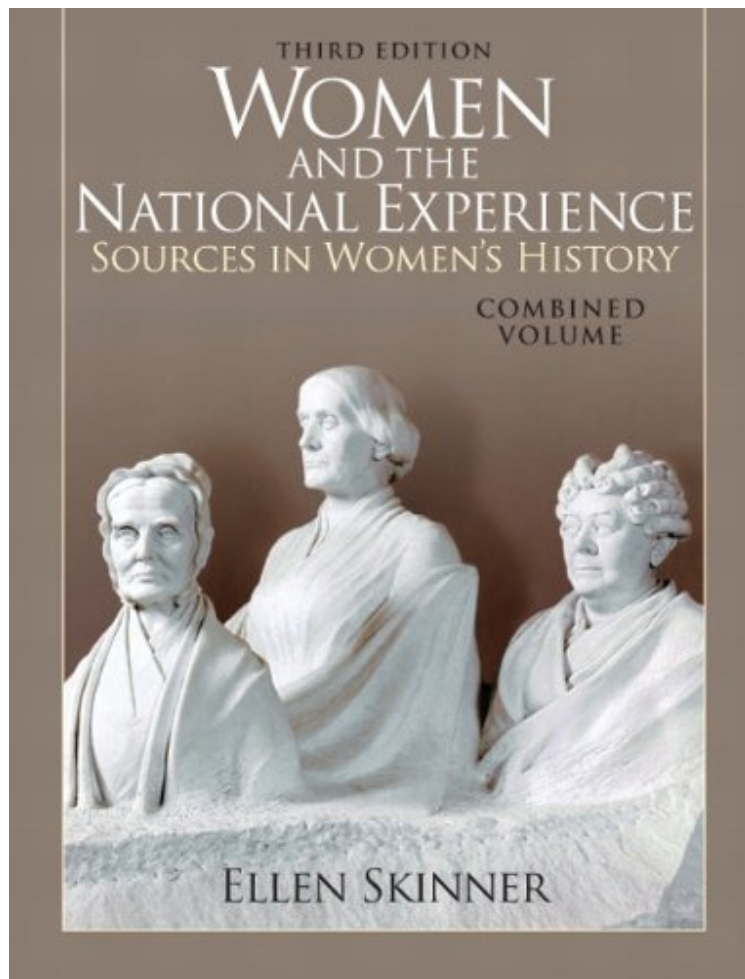

Now in its third edition, *Women and the National Experience* first was published in 1995. Her current research focuses on womens human rights as well as the connections between womens history and the environment.
